Mount Pleasant, South Carolina

With views of Charleston Harbor and the Holy City skyline across the sweeping Cooper River, The Beach Club at Charleston Harbor Resort & Marina is worth a visit for the vista alone. The resort's 92 guest rooms feature wrap-around porches and one- and two-bedroom layouts-for a tripfor-two or family-friendly getaway-with calming, coastal interiors. Outside, a private beach and multiple pools wrapped in a 30,000 square foot deckwith a bocce court, private poolside cabanas, and Charleston's only Tiki barbeckon. The Fish House serves modern, Southern fare, but when the foodie city of Charleston calls you to dine, it's just a free, 15-minute trolley or water taxi ride away. For days when further unwinding is a must, book a treatment at Estuary Spa. During summer months, pint-sized guests aged 5 to 12 can partake in the resort's Mini Mariners Children's Program, with weekly themes like science adventure, weather watchers, and Lego land.
